Since its inception, the Diplomatic Courier Service has played a critical role in safeguarding materials sent from the Department to diplomatic posts.

Whether transporting a single diplomatic pouch or several thousand pounds of equipment, Diplomatic Couriers travel throughout the far reaches of the world to ensure the secure delivery of classified and sensitive materials. They work to fulfill a singular mission. And you can, too.

EXPERIENCE NEW CHALLENGES

As a Diplomatic Courier, you will be challenged constantly. You will enjoy the excitement of new opportunities at every turn. No two duties, nor two days, are ever the same.

Throughout your career, you will be responsible for managing projects and people; coordinating diplomatic pouch transportation worldwide; ensuring the security of classified pouches; and maintaining the chain of custody while crossing international borders. You will serve in multiple worldwide assignments—each distinct and challenging in its own right—and experience rare opportunities like facilitating U.S. Secretary of State visits or transporting NASA cargo destined for the International Space Station.



As a Diplomatic Courier in the Foreign Service, you will have rewarding opportunities to:

- **Secure and serve** - provide secure transport services for diplomatic pouches containing classified and sensitive material between U.S. diplomatic missions and the U.S. Department of State.
- **Experience new cultures** - embrace continually changing assignments in domestic regional offices and U.S. diplomatic facilities overseas, and live in culturally diverse environments throughout the world.
- **Explore new horizons** - serve in a near-constant travel status using conveyances such as passenger and cargo aircraft, trucks, trains, and ships.
- **Implement and instruct** - administer diplomatic pouch security training and training assistance programs for U.S. foreign affairs personnel and officials of designated foreign governments.



A Diplomatic Courier career is never the same, be it day-to-day, month-to-month, or even year-to-year. While serving in domestic assignments, Diplomatic Couriers are available for courier missions anywhere in the world at any time—always ready for a new challenge in a different location.

To apply, you must be a U.S. citizen with at least an Associate's degree or 60 credit hours from an accredited college or university and at least 20 years old to apply and at least 21 years old to be appointed. All candidates must be appointed to the Foreign Service one month before reaching the age of 60 (preference eligible veterans excepted).

To be considered, you must obtain a Top Secret security clearance.

In return for your service, you will have access to continued training and career development programs; health and medical coverage; federal retirement benefits; and generous paid leave. When serving overseas, you will receive paid housing or an appropriate housing allowance, and paid education for dependent children (K-12).
